



2024 GOLF LEAGUE PLAYER RESPONSIBILITIES AND AGREEMENT

By choosing to play in a golf league at a City of Calgary golf course I agree to the following:

Attendance:

I understand that:

As a member of a golf league I am expected and obligated to honour my scheduled tee time.
If I cannot schedule my other life events outside of the league schedule, I will not sign up to play that day.
Any changes to league schedules more than 12 hours in advance of my tee time are to be communicated with my golf league - not the clubhouse. Calls directly to the clubhouse should be made only within 12 hours of my scheduled tee time and should be for unforeseen circumstances only.
Tee times and playing partners may be changed without notice to manage spots left open by last minute cancellations or no shows.
It is best to check in 30 minutes before my tee time.
The City of Calgary does not accept or collect green fees when I do not check in. Any penalty awarded to league players are decisions and rules made by their league.
It is the responsibility of my league executive to release unneeded tee times in advance. By releasing unneeded tee times in advance and then checking in for all spaces still scheduled for the golf league, our group will meet the cancellation guidelines.
Leagues are subject to size reduction and possible league cancellation if attendance guidelines are not met.

Rain / Weather

As the flight sheet is due approx. 24 hours before the start of league play, I will consider forecast and contact my league to release my spot before the flight sheet is due if for any reason I am unable to play the next day.

Cancellation due to weather is based on conditions at the scheduled golf course at the time of the booking. Conditions can vary widely across the city.
My league executive will communicate with clubhouse staff to access current conditions and make the decision on behalf of the entire group to cancel, or not, approximately 2 hours before the scheduled start time.
Once the decision to cancel the reservation is made, my executive is responsible for communicating the cancellation to league players.
If no communication is received I am to assume that play will go on as scheduled. I will accept the executive decision and arrive on time.
When a golf league is cancelled due to weather, but the course remains open, I know that I can still choose to play by reserving my own tee time online or by calling the clubhouse.
I understand that The City of Calgary does not require league players to arrive at a golf course on days when play has been cancelled in case weather improves, or to get credit for my attendance.

Pace-of-Play

the modernized Rules of Golf improve pace of play. golfcanada.ca/rules-of-golf/
Golf Canada also provided information to support Pace of Play and the enjoyment of the game Golf 101
pace-of-play is everyone's responsibility and proper pace comes from being efficient - not from rushing.
the pace-of-play listed on the score card is the <i>maximum</i> time to complete a round and that my pace-of-play is expected to be less than that maximum time.
The pace of play is determined by my position relative to the group ahead, not the group behind. If my group has fallen back, relative to the group ahead of us, we are behind (if we teed off immediately behind the group in front, we are expected to stay immediately behind that group).
I will remain aware of my group's pace-of-play and if we fall behind, I will actively participate in catching up. This may require picking up our balls and moving to the next hole.
I will play ready golf. Including club selection, practice swing and lining up my shot: 40 seconds is the maximum amount of time I should take to hit my ball - including putts. The clock starts when the last person's ball stops rolling.
I am aware that I am only permitted 2 minutes to look for a lost ball (local rule), and that looking for a lost ball more than 3 times during a round will put my group behind pace.
Under no circumstances will I go back to the tee box to re-hit if my tee shot is lost and I did not hit a provisional ball (see rules modernization).
I will not blame things that are out of my control as reasons for being out of position, like weather and wayward shots, but I will focus on things that are within my control.
If I am respectfully asked to pick up the pace, I will not be offended. I will remain pleasant and help the group speed up play. I know that I can ask for help or tips and that Golf Canada provides these.
I am aware that if my group is behind pace and I am not conforming with pace-of-play expectations, that I may be placing my golf league group at risk according to the Pace of Play Guidelines.

I know that my league executive is aware of these guidelines and are available to clarify information if needed.
